The American Composer Festival is proud to announce that Dennis Alexander will be our next visiting composer in April 2026. Save the date at Nazareth University for Saturday April 18, 2026.

The scope of his compositions ranges from Rote, Early Elementary through Late Intermediate and Early Advanced. There is something for every student that will inspire them to stay in music.

I have a thought for an ambitious project that may be almost impossible to come to fruition. If you are familiar with his 24 Character Preludes, my thought was to see if we could get enough students to perform ALL 24 Preludes in one recital as a surprise to Mr. Alexander. In the forward of the Prelude book, Dennis says the compositions prepare students with sounds of Bach, Mendelssohn, Schumann, Debussy, Rachmaninoff, Prokofieff and Copland.

Dennis deliberately made them short. Preludes range from 8,10,12, 22, measures to the longest 44 that takes only 35 seconds to perform. Most are one page. If you think you have students who might be interested, please let me know. I will be available in December for anyone wanting to look at his music. Please feel free to call me. Diane Habeeb and I look forward to another great ACF.
